PlayPod

We hope that children in the Juniors have been feeling positive and enthusiastic at home about our new PlayPod. For several years, we have wanted to create better play experiences for the children and FABB have worked tirelessly to help make this a reality.

PlayPod is a purpose built play facility full of scrap or loose parts from Children's Scrapstore. The scrap materials, or 'loose parts', can include anything from cardboard tubes, tyres, lengths of material, netting, rope, and much, much more. At lunchtimes, staff open the doors and the children are free to go into the pod and take out anything they like to play with.

These items of scrap can be played with however children want. The flexible nature and variety of scrap available means that the Scrapstore PlayPod creates an environment which will stimulate and enhance children's play experiences. Children are hugely imaginative and so the scrap is transformed into all kinds of different things to become part of their play as the photo below proves!

The children are delighted to know that the Scrapstore PlayPod will also be topped up with reusable and recycled scrap materials on a regular basis.

As part of our anti-bullying focus (We All Bee-long!) this year we have been getting the children ready this week to shower their family & friends, or others, with kindness. At least 2 children in each class were presented with a Kindness Certificate in assembly today for various RAKs this week and many others will have had stickers for being kind and caring to others

We are encouraging the children to be a "RAKstar" and to bring some joy and surprises to others next week. If you want to get involved as a family, we are attaching a Kindness Calendar for the month of February with lots

of wonderful RAK ideas. If your child does a RAK that they would like to share with the school, then take a photo or write it down and we will share it at assembly as we love to be inspired by others Happy RAKing!

Pupil behaviour

As you know, I am incredibly proud of the children at Archbishop Benson and every day they do such wonderful things which show our school values in action. Now and again incidences or behaviours can occur that cause us a little concern and where that happens we like to be as pre-emptive and proactive as possible in addressing them. In Spring 1 we have noticed that quite a few of our Year 4 children are using an increasing amount of sex-related language with their peers. We wanted to make our Y4 parents aware of this and to seek their support.

As part of our SRE provision, year on year, we provide sex & relationships education for all our children in the Summer term and our wonderful staff do a fantastic job in introducing the children to age-related themes and vocabulary with in a safe & supportive learning environment. We have no problem with the children knowing and using age-appropriate SRE language in the right context. We also know that sometimes they will experiment a little with using some of these words in the playground and we are always poised to deal with that. However in Year 4 at the moment a number of children are using both age-related and some surprising non age-related SRE language quite frequently in the playground. It may be linked to the fact that some of them are teasing each other, as seen in the disco last night, about boyfriends and girlfriends and are getting a bit carried away.

It may well be that some Y4 children have older siblings and are just aware of more adult vocabulary at home but we also know that some of the children are telling us that they play 18+ computer games. If they, or older siblings, are doing so online then they could be being exposed to some horrific language. Myself, Mrs Teasdale and Mr Thomas will speak to Y4 after half and I will do some assemblies on positive language and choices. We thought that half-term might be the ideal time for you to talk to your child and maybe have an informal SRE discussion with them. They may know words or have questions that they would like the chance to discuss with you. You can talk to them about what might be appropriate to speak about at home and then remind them about our expectation, and your expectations, for behaviour in school. We wanted to make you aware of our actions so that if, by any chance, your child mentions having been spoken to about using SRE language, or being around when SRE language is being used, then you are aware of the background.

Thank you for your support and both Mrs Teasdale and Mr Thomas are more than happy to speak to you if you have any questions or concerns.

Parking on school grounds

I would like to bring a safeguarding situation to your attention. Several concerned parents have contacted me this week because over the last few weeks they have observed an increasing issue when parents are picking up children from after school clubs, particularly on a Tuesday.

Parents have reported that instead of finding a car parking space some parents are now stopping in the dropping off area as well as queuing down the school driveway from the gates. Parents said that it was particularly bad on Tuesday this week. They felt that some parents just abandoned their cars on the school driveway, and walked down to reception to collect their child. This action then blocked the whole area, so that other parents were stuck down by the crossing unable to park anywhere. What concerns us, in school, is that this action also resulted in children and parents having to cross over the school driveway in between cars and staff did not have a clear view in front of them as they are dismissing the children. Parents who spoke to me felt that such driving/parking is just an accident waiting to happen. What frustrated these parents is that there were plenty of parking spaces around for all parents but those who were in the queue did not have enough room to reverse into them or go down to the old playground to park as cars were coming out, having collected their children properly.

We recognise that the vast majority of our parents drive/park carefully and sensibly when on school grounds. We also know that no parent would intentionally wish to harm any child. Therefore we would just like to remind all our parents to exercise courtesy and consideration when parking at any time of the day. I have asked our site supervisors, and staff in general, to be extra vigilant. It may be that a member of staff might speak to individual parents if they have concerns about driving or parking. We would hope that you would not take offence if we were to do so. As ever, the safety of your children is of paramount importance to us.


