#### **Attendance**

With two terms completed, our whole school attendance rate for the year so far is 96.6%. Based on the Ofsted table above, this shows that the attendance of the vast majority of our pupils is well above the national average of 95.4%. This is a tremendous achievement and we are so pleased. The more the children are in school, then the better the outcomes are for them each week.

A special congratulations to 3SP. They are the winners again(!) of our termly Attendance Cup for being the best attending class in the Spring term. As well as winning the Attendance Cup, they also earn the right to a special reward which they can agree with their class teacher.

Well done to the 129 pupils (30%) who managed 100% attendance in the Spring term. Two terms into the year, we now have 64 pupils (15%) with 100% attendance. Well done to them.

#### **School Uniform in the Summer term**

Girls may continue to wear their school skirts in the Summer term, but may wish to opt for a short-sleeved white shirt. However, they may wish to wear their Summer uniform instead:

☐ White socks ☐ Black shoes (no heels, trainers or open-toed footwear)
We have already reminded the girls that we do not expect hem to mix and match the uniform, eg wear the summe dress with tights.

☐ Grey shorts (hopefully!) or grey trousers ☐ From Reception to Year 2 – red polo shirt with schoologo
□ From Year 3 – Year 6 – white shirts (may be shortsleeved)
☐ Grey or black socks
Black shoes (no trainers or open-toed footwear)

I saw quite a number of tie-less children this week, and I think there may be a little bit of confusion around when children can discard the school tie in the Summer term. Where KS2 girls or boys are wearing a white shirt, they must continue to wear a tie until May half term.
