Online Safety

With the Summer holidays fast approaching, I am sure that you are planning lots of fun activities for your children. While we know that will involve being out and about, it may also be that your children will also spend some time online as well. We thought that you might welcome some information on online safety.

We know how difficult it can be to find the time when you're a busy parent, and also just how daunting it can be to try and work out if the safety information you've found online is up-to-date.That is why we are signposting you to the Internet Matters website.

Internet Matters is a portal dedicated to making sure all parents are only a click away from advice, tips and support about online safety for children. The information is divided into age-appropriate sections to help you talk to your child about the issues and technologies they will come across as they grow up online. From setting your parental controls to teaching your child how to be a good friend online, you will find a wealth of information that is simple and accessible

Today your children will bring home one of three online safety sheets which are pitched at either 0 - 5 years, 6 - 10 years or 11-13 years. We think they are really helpful and if you want to find out more or watch any of the information videos, then go the Internet Matters website (see address below) and have a browse.
