The choir was a real credit to the school. It was wonderful to see them in action and their harmonisation impressed us all so much. We were treated to the full range of musical ability and experience from our wonderfully enthusiastic Y2 beginners playing Recorder Rock on their recorders to our guitar and ukelele players performing together a beautiful piece called Caribbean Moonlight, finishing with a rousing performance by the choir of "Rocking All Over the World"

The peripatetic teachers were so lovely with their pupils and it is no surprise that the children went on to perform so confidently and competently. We are hugely grateful to Miss McDonald for coordinating this recital and for ensuring that it all came to life on the afternoon.

Playtime behaviour

The overall behaviour of our children is always a source of great pride to the school. We regularly receive positive reports from the local community when our children are out on trips. Inside school, time and time again I see the children demonstrating reals acts of kindness towards each other, and governors speak so positively of how they see the children interacting with adults and other children, when they do their governor visits. However, in the past term or so there have been a number of incidences of poor behaviour among our Junior children in the playground that have caused us some concern. At our staff meeting this week, we met to discuss how we can refine and strengthen our whole-school approach to behaviour management in the playground to ensure happy playtimes for all our pupils. We looked at:

- how to celebrate and reward the consistent good behaviour of the vast majority of our pupils;
- how we will review with the children their use of the PlayPod equipment to sort out any glitches;
- what will be our non-negotiables in terms of behaviour expectations;
- how we will record playground incidences more effectively and consistently.

Teachers discussed some recurring behaviours that we will be focusing on particularly in the Summer term.

- We do not accept the use of rude or inappropriate language or gestures. At the moment, this is

particularly prevalent among a group of our Y4 boys. Many of our children are telling us that they experience these words through adult computer games, often online. We will be monitoring and challenging this in the Summer term.

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- We will be working with the children on what we call the "Big 3". There are 3 particular actions that are causing problems in the Junior playground at the moment – children doing "play attacks" on each other's dens, raiding each other's dens for scrap, using scrap in the wrong way or with excessive force
- We will be training the children to have real respect for the PlayPod equipment and know how to handle it properly, how to share it with others and how to tidy it away responsibly and properly
- We will also be just as proactive in responding to other forms of poor friendship or unacceptable behaviour.

I will be addressing our focus on positive playtimes with the children in a number of assemblies after the Easter holidays. I wanted to make you aware of some of the points I will be covering as I will be encouraging teachers to follow up in class, and that may mean that, as well as class circle time, teachers may have a chat with a group of children or an individual child. Please don't worry unduly if your child mentions that they have been spoken to. If there were a real problem, then the school would have contacted you. We are just trying to help children to understand how to make more positive choices, particularly in the playground.

We will be introducing the children to our new Playtime Logs. These logs will be used by staff to develop a consistent approach to recording poor behaviour in the playground. We will then be able to use these logs to track patterns of behaviour and to support our pupils better. It may be that we will need, on occasion, to introduce a Playtime Behaviour Report to support any child who may be struggling to self-manage their own behaviour in the playground. Parents would always be informed and involved with this.

We would be really grateful if you could help us in our efforts. We would encourage all our parents to talk to their children about what positive play means to them and how they can help to promote that in the playground. Please can you also remind your children of the importance of reporting poor behaviour as soon as it occurs? We explain to the children that it really helps if they report the problem to the **same** teacher or TA or lunchtime supervisor each time. In that way, they become aware if the problem is more than just a one-off incident. All children can use their mood pebbles or pick sticks on their classrooms and place them on the red, amber or green mats or buckets to indicate if they need any support or guidance. All teachers and TAs are being asked to be particularly vigilant next term in checking the pebbles or pick sticks daily.

We know that all our parents understand that we are a genuine community school which means that we welcome a wide and varied intake of pupils every year. It is inevitable that within a cohort of 60 pupils each year, we will have pupils with a range of physical, social, and emotional needs. Sometimes these needs can have behavioural symptoms. We never consider a child with a behavioural need to be a naughty child. All behaviour is a form of communication and we work hard and successfully with children, and their families, to move them from expressing themselves physically to verbally. It can be a longer journey for some children more than others. At times it may feel to some parents that we could be treating some children too leniently or not punishing the "naughty" children enough. Whilst we cannot discuss individual children with parents, we can assure them that we use a comprehensive range of strategies and plans to support pupils with recurring behavioural issues, including external agencies, but we do so discreetly and sensitively in keeping with our school values.

We are never complacent about pupil behaviour, which is why we maintain an annual Friendship/Anti-Bullying focus every year. If you go to our school website, click in School Info and then click on Our Aims & Values, you can scroll down and find our 2015 - 2016 Friendship/Anti-Bullying Overview and see how hard we work to maintain a high focus on good behaviour and citizenship. We know that we don't always get it right all of the time, but we are very proud that the 3 year percentage average for how satisfied parents are with pupil behaviour in school is 95%. We remained committed to high standards of behaviour and are looking forward to a Summer term of pupils making proactive behaviour choices and creating positive playtimes together. Thank you for your support in making this happen.
