Writing

- Use role play areas for writing & communicating.

- Poetry, descriptive, non-fiction safety posters, recounts.
- Descriptive writing
- Using adjectives to describe settings, pirates, treasures, marine animals.
- Write simple phrases and sentences that can be read by others
- Write recognisable letters, most of which are correctly formed.

- Begin to use tally charts and

Understanding the World
